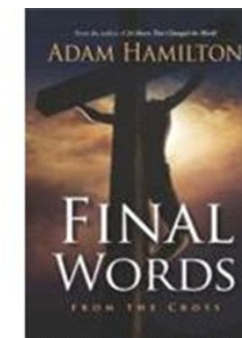

Lenten Bible Study



In 24 Hours That Changed the World, Adam Hamilton took us on a Lenten journey through the last day of Jesus' life. Now in this inspiring follow-up book, Hamilton explores these final words as seen and heard through the eyes and ears of those who stood near the cross. Despite the serious effort and increased pain required for Jesus to speak as he hung on the cross, Jesus spoke seven "final words" statements that have much to teach us about Jesus, his Father, and ourselves:

- Father Forgive Them
- Behold Your Son...Behold Your Mother
- My God, Why Have You Forsaken Me?
- Today You Will Be with Me in Paradise
- I Thirst
- It Is Finished
- Into Your Hands I Commit My Spirit

Each chapter begins with the biblical account followed by a first-person story as might have been told from the viewpoint of one of the characters at the cross. Then the chapter explores the meaning of Jesus' dying words for our lives today. Following the last statement, a postscript recounts the words Jesus spoke following his resurrection, including what truly were the final words Jesus spoke while walking this earth.

Studies will be held as follows:

- Thursday evenings at 6:30 p.m. beginning February 23rd.
- Sunday mornings at 8:30 a.m. beginning February 26th.
- Tuesday afternoons at 12:30 p.m. beginning February 28th.

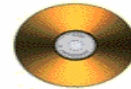

Aspire to Inspire

"O Love That Will Not Let Me Go"

O Love that will not let me go,
I rest my weary soul in thee;
I give thee back the life I owe,
That in thine ocean depths its flow
May richer, fuller be.

George Matheson (1842-1906) wrote the words to this much-loved hymn while feeling intensely lonely and afraid.

Years back, his fiancé had broken their engagement upon learning he was going blind. Despite that challenge, Matheson had followed God's call to a fruitful pastoral ministry – with his sister's assistance. Now his sister was getting married, and Matheson worried about who would take care of him and if anyone would ever want to marry him.

Amid such despair, Matheson later shared, God gave him all four verses of this hymn in five minutes. **It's a poignant reminder that God's love sustains us even when human love falls short.**

FUMC Supports Guadalupe Community Center

Five volunteers from First United Methodist traveled to Greeley on December 29, to prepare and serve the evening meal to approximately 50 people at the new facility of the Guadalupe Community Center located at 1442 North 11th Avenue in Greeley.

The Guadalupe Center is funded by Catholic Charities of Denver and by other donations. The facility, open from 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. 365 days per year, can house up to sixty individuals. There are separate areas for single men, single women, and families with children. The shelter also provides shower facilities, breakfast and evening meals, job referrals, and other support services for shelter residents. Meals are served to single women and families beginning at 5:30 p.m. Single men are served at 6:00 p.m.

The missions team from FUMC has signed up to serve at least four evening meals during 2012. All of our scheduled dates are fifth Thursdays which occur on March 29, May 31, August 30, and November 29. Only four or five volunteers are needed for each date. Their duties will include grocery shopping, food preparation (all of which must be done at the shelter), serving the meal, and some cleanup. We are attempting to establish a standardized menu that will be served each time we volunteer. The meal will consist of tacos (including ground beef, cheese, lettuce, tomatoes, and sour cream), a fruit compote, a vegetable, and a dessert of cake or brownies. The shopping list is compiled with the cooperation of the shelter's food service coordinator as the number of meals varies from day to day throughout the year.

The mission team has agreed that each volunteer from our church will contribute \$10 toward the meal that is served on a given day. The remainder of the cost of the meal will come from funds accumulated for this mission from special missions collections during the Easter and Christmas seasons.

If you are interested in helping with this mission, please contact Bill Pratt (686-7319). Your name will be added to the list of volunteers. It is anticipated that each person will be called on to help only once or twice a year.

This number appears many times in Scripture, often indicating a time of trial or testing, or simply marking something significant. It rained 40 days and nights during the Great Flood. Taking this symbolic number to heart, the Christian church has long observed 40 days of Lent (not counting Sundays).

Preacher Donald English invites us to imagine that we are tulip bulbs. We are all tucked away together in a wooden box on the shelf at the garden store. It's not the most exciting life in the world, but everybody is comfortable and we get along well with the other bulbs in the box. One day a *giant* hand reaches down into the box! There is widespread panic when the hand scoops out a huge handful of bulbs and then disappears. When things settle down, one of the tulip bulbs speaks to the other bulbs that were left behind, "Whew! That was a close call! How lucky we are, because we've heard what happens to those bulbs taken by the giant hand. The gardener will dig a hole in the ground and bury them. They will die down there, and the earth will freeze over them. We're the lucky ones. We're still safe and secure in our cozy little box. Praise God!"

Maybe you can relate to those tulip bulbs when you think about your faith journey. I have to say I've never been too receptive to anyone who's tried to grab me and plant me in a place I didn't want to be. The gardener knows the only way tulips reach their true potential is when they are planted. He knows they will never bloom in a box at the garden store. God knows the same is true with us, that the true purpose and full potential of our lives is realized when we allow ourselves to be placed in the hands of The Master Gardener. Sometimes we resist because we are comfortable and satisfied with where we are and who we are. And even when we are not satisfied, we often still resist because we dread the thought of going through change.

Although, we may be like those tulip bulbs in some ways, the analogy breaks down. Even though God knows our full potential lies in a relationship with Him, he doesn't scoop us up and forcibly plant us in his kingdom. Instead, God invites and lets each of us make our own decision to accept. In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus' first recorded words are: "*The time has come. The kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news!*" (Mark 1:15) In the very next verse, we read that several fishermen decide to accept Jesus' invitation. We also know these same men had occasions to reconsider Jesus' invitation and to renew their decision to be planted in God's kingdom.

The approaching Lenten season offers us the same opportunity to make a new or renewed acceptance of Jesus' invitation. Will we stay in the box where we are? Or will we put ourselves in the hands of the Gardener to be planted in a new place to bloom and blossom into more of who God wants us to be? "The time has come," but not for God's giant hand to scoop you away. What has come is the time for His invitation: "The kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news!" What kind of bulb will you be?
