# Learn Something New!

## Seeds

The Bible often uses seeds as symbols of faith or God's Word. In the Old Testament, seeds also refer to offspring. Jesus said people who believe in him can perform mighty deeds with "faith the size of a mustard seed" (Luke 17:6, NRSV). Many of Jesus' teachings use seed imagery; for example, in the parable of the four soils, he said the seed, God's Word, can grow only when people hear it, "hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bear fruit with patient endurance" (Luke 8:15, NRSV).

## Follow God's song

In Max Lucado's *The Song of the King* (Crossway Books), three knights long to marry a princess, so her father arranges a contest. Suitors must travel through a dark forest full of frightening creatures. Each suitor may select one travel partner.

One suitor selects the princess's brother, who displays an ivory flute, one of only two in the kingdom; the other flute is his father's. The flutes play the same song. "[The] king will play from the castle wall," the prince says. "Follow his song, and you will find the castle."

How did the winning suitor avoid getting confused by creatures who imitated the king's song? "I knew ... only one ... could play the song as you do," he tells the king. "So I asked [the prince] to travel with me. As we journeyed, he played. I learned your song so well that though a thousand false flutes tried to hide your music, I could still hear you."

God's song is love, and his Son, Jesus, plays it, too. When Jesus is our companion through life's darkness and confusion, he'll lead us safely to our heavenly King.

## Whatever the weather

No matter the forecast, weather can remind us of God's presence:

- When it's sunny, remember that Jesus is the light of the world (John 8:12).
- When it's cloudy, remember that God often spoke to and guided his people from a cloud (Exodus 13:21-22.)
- During a thunderstorm, remember the thunder and lightning when God beckoned Moses to Mount Sinai (Exodus 19:16).
- When it rains or snows, remember that God's Word serves his purpose just as precipitation does (Isaiah 55:10-11).
- When it's windy, remember that "a wind from God" came at Creation (Genesis 1:2), and God's Holy Spirit arrived at Pentecost like a mighty wind (Acts 2:2).

# Bob's Reflection

## Bob's Reflection

Over the course of the three years I resided in Germany, I continually sought to improve my language skills and become acquainted with the German culture. About once a week I worked with a tutor who, while trying to teach me the language, also engaged in conversations about significant events in the country's history. One of the events she explained was the demolition of the Berlin Wall in 1989. The wall had separated East and West Germany, and for the most part, those on the Eastern side lived as captives with no entry into West Germany permitted. But it all changed in 1989—the wall came down, there was a massive celebration, and people from the East came in droves across the border into West Germany. They were free at last! But my tutor explained, that after only a few days in West Germany, many East Germans returned home. They simply did not know what to do with their new found freedom. It seems they understood that had been freed *from* something, but they did not understand they had been freed *for* something.

Such is the challenge of freedom. Probably the day we most publicly celebrate our freedom in the United States is Independence Day. It marks the day it was “declared” that God has given each person the right to “life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness;” and it marks the day it was declared that any forces that tried to deny the full expression of this freedom would no longer be tolerated. Since that time, many men and women have made, are making, and will continue to make great sacrifices toward the cause of protecting our freedom. Why then, in a country founded on freedom, have so many of us made choices that have resulted in various states of physical, emotional, social, and spiritual captivity? How often do you think to yourself or hear somebody else say, “I’m trapped...I’m stuck here—in this job, with this lifestyle, in this situation, with these problems.”

Freedom to choose is God's blessing and intention for human beings— but it is also a challenge. This is why living in freedom is part of our relationship with Jesus Christ. Jesus said, “*If the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed*” (John 8:36). The Apostle Paul wrote, “*The Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom*” (2Corinthians 3:17). When Jesus and Paul speak of freedom, they are speaking first about freedom *from* the negative feelings of guilt and remorse that come when we use our freedom in a way that harms ourselves and others. Jesus said, “*Everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin*” (John 8:34). When we trust Jesus, he gives us to power to break free of the choices that serve only to limit our freedom, even those choices that have become habitual.

Being set free *from* something is only part of the blessing and challenge of freedom. In Jesus Christ, we are also set free *for* the purpose of new life in Christ. If we choose not to accept this second part of freedom in Christ, we are like those East German captives who simply returned to the place they were before they were set free. But we are given the freedom to change, to *not* go back, but to go forward by the ongoing presence of the Holy Spirit dwelling in each of us who have invited Christ into our lives. We are set free in Christ for the purpose of knowing God, loving God, and serving God. We are set free to enjoy “life to the full” that Jesus promised. So may your summer continue “Spirit Filled.” Because “*The Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom!*”



I recently saw a church billboard that had a quote much like this, "Our interruptions may be God's missions." How many times do we find ourselves rushing out the door because the phone rang when we planned to leave, a child spilled something and we had to clean it up, or we lost track of time doing something else? Or perhaps we are detoured because of an accident or distraction that causes us to go another way.

A few years ago my children and I were on our way to Wal-Mart in Loveland, and for some reason I took a "detour." We were driving along on a back road, almost to our destination, when I saw a child walking along the road alone. School had let out recently so I didn't think all too much about it, but what did catch my eye was the fact that the child appeared to be only 5 or 6 years old, and he was walking on the side of the street that didn't have a sidewalk only a vacant field. In that few seconds I had made a mental note as well as commented out loud how odd it seemed to be.

The next few blocks went by fast, and when we got to the store we found a spot to park...quite close to the front door which was unusual. We got out...walked in...grabbed a cart. The boys took off together as they usually did and Courtney stayed with me. That's when we heard it...the Code Adam.

Many stores have the Code Adam, and it is used when a child (or other person) goes missing in the store. Employees are asked to search their departments and customers are asked to watch for the person.

Now, I'm sure you can guess where this is going.

"The boy is 6 years old, wearing blue jeans and a red t-shirt. He was last seen with his mom in the electronics department."

Courtney and I looked at each other. Was that the boy we had seen walking down the street? We ran to customer service to find the mother completely distraught. I told her what I had seen and she began to run to the doors. I chased after her and offered to drive her to where I saw the child.

We found him just a few feet from where I had seen him as I was driving to the store. The mother jumped out of the car before I could even put it in park, and grabbed her son. She brought the boy back to the car and we went back to Wal-Mart. The Code Adam was cancelled. The boy was walking home because he thought his mom had left him there when she couldn't find him since he had walked off.

In that moment God had used my "interruption" to fulfill His "mission." And in that moment God reminded me how happy He is when one of His children is "found" and brought back home safely.

My Grandma use to say, "Everything happens for a reason. God's reason. Sometimes we learn the 'why' and sometimes we don't. But we can always be sure God leads us where he needs us and we just need to have faith."

# Stephen Ministry Corner

## New Stephen Minister Training Class Set to Begin

Caring ministry at our church will be expanding soon, as members are set to begin Stephen Minister training at the end of September. At the completion of their training in March, they will be commissioned as Stephen Ministers. They will then join the Stephen Ministry Team in providing one-to-one care to individuals experiencing difficulties in life.

"Stephen Ministry training combines sound theological principles with contemporary psychology," says *Ken Iliff*, who, along with Stephen Leaders Susan and Tara, will teach the class. "The training is top-notch. The skills our Stephen Ministers learn and practice prepare them to provide a very high level of Christian caregiving. The training is intense because it explores some serious life issues, but it is also a growth producing and enjoyable experience."

The 50 hours of Stephen Ministry training is broken down into twenty 2 1/2-hour sessions that will be held on Sunday evenings. Among the training topics are:

- Feelings: Yours, Mine, and Ours
- The Art of Listening
- Distinctively Christian Caring
- Assertiveness: Relating Gently and Firmly
- Maintaining Boundaries in Caregiving
- Confidentiality
- Ministering to Those Experiencing Grief
- Caring for People before, during, and after Hospitalization

More than a quarter-million people have gone through Stephen Ministry training in more than 7,000 churches' worldwide since the ministry began in 1975.

"We're definitely part of significant ministry that cares for people one on one". "The impact of Stephen Ministry on our congregation has been tremendous. People whose needs might otherwise slip through the cracks are coming face to face with Jesus' love through their Stephen Minister. Our new class will help us touch that many more lives with the Gospel."

Please lift up the training class in your prayers over the coming months and watch for regular training class updates in the newsletter and Sunday bulletin.
