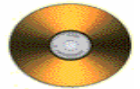

So with that in mind we have implemented the use of an "Accident/Incident Form". This form will be filled out and signed by the caregiver and parent to help with the communication around things that happen while the children are in our care. Even if the accident doesn't seem to have caused injury we want to communicate with the parents in case symptoms appear later. This is especially true in the case of head injuries. Parents will get a copy of the form once it has been filled out and signed, and another copy will be kept in the nursery's information book. The original copy will be left on file in the church office. We want parents to know their children are in good hands. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to come talk to me. 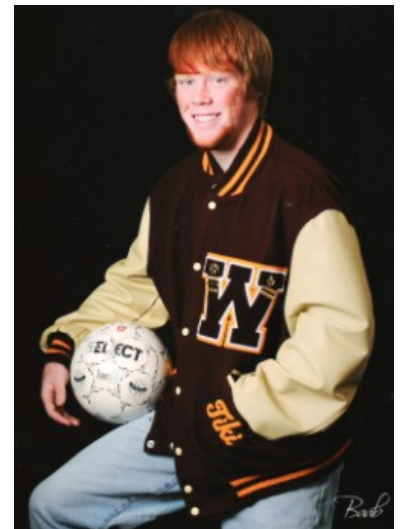
Matthew Lee

I recently came across a book I've had for a very long time called *Letters From Camp*. It is a compilation of postcards and letters received by parents from their children who were away at summer camp. Here's a sample:

Dear Folks,

We had a real monkey as a pet in our bunk.

*We drew straws to see who would take the monkey home
and I won! Aren't you proud of me?*

Love, Marty.

Now, what kind of reaction would you have to a letter like that? Even if you do not have children, how would you respond? "Oh no...we are not set up to handle something like THAT! Don't bring it home, it will disrupt our lives and our household! It's just not practical! Please...Let somebody else take it home. Can't you bring home a turtle instead?"

It's likely your response would express fear of getting hold of something over which you have very little control. It is that way too, with the news that Jesus of Nazareth has risen from the dead, and is going ahead to the places where we, as His disciples, live, work, and play. Something over which we have little control—the Spirit of the Living God—is asking to enter our lives.

In the Book of Acts, Peter preached, *"God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead"* (Acts 10:40). You see, Jesus' bunkmates of three years were the first ones invited to "take the monkey home." Most of you reading this message also are and have been Jesus' bunkmates for some period of time. Now He's asking you to take Him into your home and into your lives in a new way; a way you might not be set up for right now; a way that likely will cause some disruptions; a way that might seem impractical.

It was not easy for those first disciples to set out preaching and living the Good News of Jesus Christ. It is challenging for us too. Nicky Gumbel, teacher of the Alpha course, said "The Christian life is not an easy life— but it is a GREAT life!" Think of it this way: God drew straws to see who would take the Living Jesus Christ home... and YOU WON! Have a wonderfully Blessed Easter season.

A mother's hope

Three years ago, contemporary Christian musician Steven Curtis Chapman and his wife Mary Beth faced the sudden death of their youngest daughter, Maria, in a driveway accident. In the book *Choosing to See: A Journey of Struggle and Hope*, Mary Beth Chapman describes how she wrestled with God when her "whole world" fell apart.

"What I've found is that it's in the most unlikely times and places of hurt and chaos that God gives us a profound sense of his presence and the real light of his hope in the dark places," she writes.

"None of my tears have been wasted," Chapman says, because she's "experienced the kindness, sweetness, faithfulness, and redemptive heard of God."

To honor their daughter, the Chapmans, longtime adoption advocates, established Maria's Big House of Hope. The center in Henan, one of China's poorest provinces, provides life-saving medical care to special-needs orphans.

God of the little things

Little things matter. When God gets involved in the minutia of life, unmistakably intervening in the smallest details of our day-to-day dilemmas, it means he cares enough to bother with what's bothering us. The God who created the vast universe works through life's circumstances to bring about his good purposes. That's big.

We know, too, that if God is involved in our everyday lives, he's also working on the more complicated situations — the big things. He might just be working behind the scenes.




When troubles come and God seems not to notice, think of times when he's intervened. Recount and revel in them. Rest assured in God's perfect plan for big and small. "We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28, NRSV).

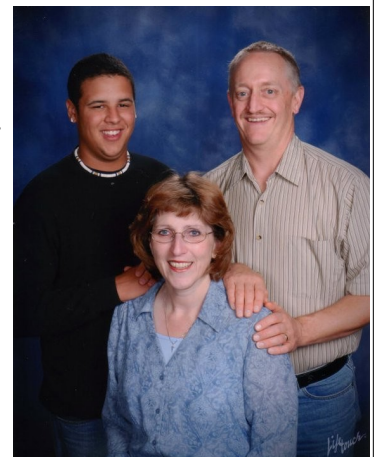

FUMC Windsor 2011 Summer Worship Schedule

Our Worship Committee and Leadership Team have agreed to modify our Sunday worship schedule for the summer months as follows:

Beginning Sunday, May 29, 2011 (fifth Sunday) we will begin holding ONE worship service beginning at 10 AM.

The general format on the first three (four in July) Sundays of the month will be Traditional Worship with a wide variety of music specials.

The last Sunday of each month will be a "Blended" format music wise but will contain many of the same elements of worship (which is our current practice).

The hour preceding worship, 9 AM – 10AM is reserved for Spiritual Formation: summer Sunday school and small group studies. Anyone who feels called to lead a study or discussion during this time is encouraged and we will help promote it. Groups may choose to convene earlier than 9 AM to accommodate the study material.

We hope to continue Children's Church during the summer

Coffee Fellowship will be from 9:15 AM – 9:45 AM and will be offered only as volunteers sign up to provide it (we are not "assigning" groups for FFF during the summer months.)

We have also asked some folk to be members of a design team to review, evaluate, and recommend ideas for revising and recreating our current contemporary worship service.

A recent worldwide Leadership Summit of United Methodist Churches reports that the ability to offer a variety of worship experiences and styles is one of the four critical characteristics of vital and growing churches. God has richly gifted our church to do exactly this and we will be deliberate in seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit in planning all of our worship services.

Change in Procedure for Use of Church Van

Our insurance company, Church Mutual, requires we use the following procedure to authorize drivers of our church van.

Anyone wishing to drive the church van must complete a Driver Application form, available in the church office. The application will be sent to Church Mutual Insurance for review and approval. The application needs to be submitted at least 15 days prior to using the van. Each driver will be asked to present a valid license, proof of personal insurance, and read/watch "The Road to Safer Transportation" booklet and DVD which are also available in the church office. This requirement applies to driving the FUMC-owned van or any rental vehicle used in a church activity.
