Cornucopia

**Cornucopia**, a Greek word meaning “horn of plenty,” has origins in Greek mythology. But the cornucopia became a religious symbol and was even stamped on Jewish coins. Overflowing horns, now common as Thanksgiving centerpieces, came to symbolize abundance and blessings.

### Five kernels

The Plymouth Pilgrims celebrated the first Thanksgiving Day in fall 1621, but by the next May, their food supply was depleted. The harvest of 1622 was a failure, and the Pilgrims often lived for days on just a few kernels of corn.

Amid a drought in 1623, the people sought divine intervention. After praying for nine hours on a hot July day, they were blessed with a two-week rainfall. Edward Winslow wrote, “It was hard to say whether our withered corn or drooping affections were most quickened and revived.” The Pilgrims never went hungry again.

Start a Thanksgiving tradition by placing five kernels of corn at each place setting. Point out a blessing that each kernel represents. For example:

1. God loves us.
2. God provides for all our needs.
3. God gives us friends, just as the Indians befriended the Pilgrims.
4. God hears and answers our prayers.
5. God is preparing a place for us in heaven.

Then have family members share five things for which they're grateful.

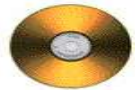

## Gestures of gratitude

In 2005, a female humpback whale became entangled in a web of crab traps and lines just east of the Farallon Islands, off the San Francisco coast. Hundreds of yards of line rope were wrapped around her body, tail, torso and mouth, weighing her down so much that she struggled to stay afloat.

A fisherman spotted the whale and radioed for help. When rescuers arrived, they determined that the only way to save the creature was to dive in and untangle her. This was a dangerous proposition, as one slap of the tail could be deadly.

Rescuers worked for hours with curved knives and eventually freed the whale. What she did next surprised the divers: She swam in what seemed like joyous circles, coming back to each person, one at a time, nudging them gently, in what rescuers assumed was a beautiful gesture of thanks.

May you and those you love be surrounded by people who help you get untangled from whatever is binding you and may you always know the joy of giving and receiving gratitude.

# Bob's Reflection

## Bob's Reflection

November 2011

What are your goals? How each of us answers that question provides enormous insight into how we live our lives. Researchers have identified that goals make the difference in success or failure for people of similar backgrounds and educational standards. Studies find that 3% of people are highly successful in their life plans and careers, 30% are moderately successful and 67% just exist. The significant difference for the 3% who are highly successful is that they have written down, specific goals. The 30% who are moderately successful have a general idea of where they are going but don't have any goals formalized. The rest are happy to watch the world go by. What is interesting is that people in the 30% category only need to put in a small effort to jump into the next group.

Each year, the care facility where my mother lived asked me to state in writing the goals my mother and I hoped to achieve in the coming year. It made sense when she first became a resident. At that time her goals had to do with which activities she could learn to participate in and how she could acclimate to her new living arrangements. As my mom's abilities declined, it was tempting to just not bother with goals. It didn't make sense, I thought. But I was wrong, it did make sense, and perhaps those goals were even more important. Setting goals in situations where options are more limited caused me to think about the things most important to her quality of life and to focus her caregivers on fulfilling them. I discovered that setting goals made a huge positive impact on my relationship with all the people who would come to be a part of my mother's life. Because goals were clear and communicated, specific plans could be developed and resources organized.

Goal setting is noticed often in Scripture. Listen to what the Apostle Paul wrote in his letter to the Philippians: *"I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead. Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already arrived at my goal, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me."* Philippians 3:10-15 (New International Version)

Of course all kinds of things happened for Paul on his life's journeys. But it was his goals that caused and directed his plans—and he was successful.

Does God want us set goals for our church? Well, God sure doesn't want his followers to just "watch the world go by," or even be just moderately successful. I suggest that Jesus Christ, wants His church to be HUGELY and highly successful! Goals are essential to success in all areas of life including our faith life. With all this in mind our leadership team will be considering specific goals in the ministry areas of: *Worship Participation, Forming New Disciples* (those new to the Christian faith or not connected with a faith community,) involvement in *Intentional Faith Development* through small groups/Sunday school (all ages,) and participation in local and global *Mission and Outreach* ministries (both through serving and through financial support.) Of course we already are quite active in these ministry areas and our goals will help us determine what to keep, drop, or create that will help us take the next steps forward toward the mission to Make Disciples of Jesus Christ for the Transformation of the World.

Over the next few weeks, you will be invited to be in conversation about all of these things. In the meantime, for all who wish to be highly successful in any area of life; for all who want to make a significant positive impact on relationships with God and with others; for all who want focus, here is the question, "What are your goals?"

*What is a DOVE group?*

### Discerning Our Vision and Expectations from God

In the Bible the dove is a sign of God's presence and a sign of hope.

It was a dove that brought Noah an olive branch signaling the new prosperity for humankind.

It was a dove that descended at Jesus' baptism signaling our future in Jesus Christ, God's Beloved Son.

*What will the DOVE groups do?*

Three things:

Develop a shared understanding of our community.

Develop shared beliefs about how the power of Jesus Christ and His church can make a difference.

Develop shared beliefs about how those particular gifts and opportunities God has given *our* congregation can make a difference.

*How will it work?*

Several of our members will host groups of up to ten people in their homes for a two hour guided conversation. The conversation will be facilitated by two or three members of our leadership team and Pastor Bob.

*What will happen with results of the DOVE group conversations?*

The information will be summarized and prayed over. Based on what is discerned, our leadership team will suggest and propose ministry goals and plans for consideration at our next All Church Conference on December 11, 2011. The proposal will include goals for each year 2012 through 2015.

*When will these groups get together?*

DOVE Group meetings will be planned the Week of November 14.

*How do I sign up?*

Sign up sheets will be available beginning Sunday morning, November 6.

The very first followers of Jesus asked where he was headed, Jesus said to them, and He says to us who want to know where Jesus is leading our church, "*Come and See!*"

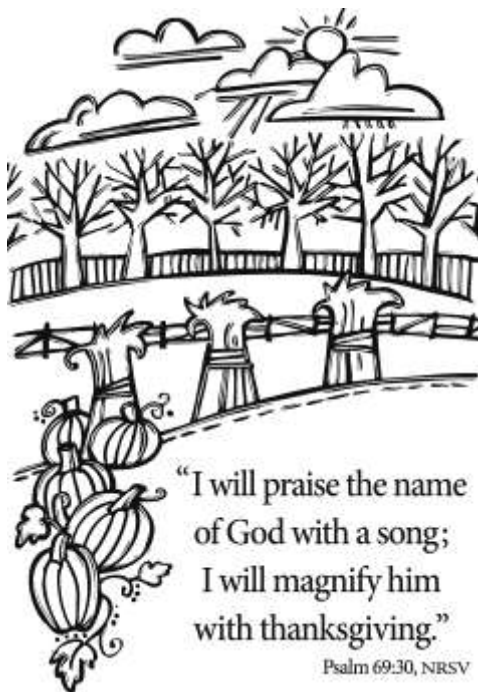
